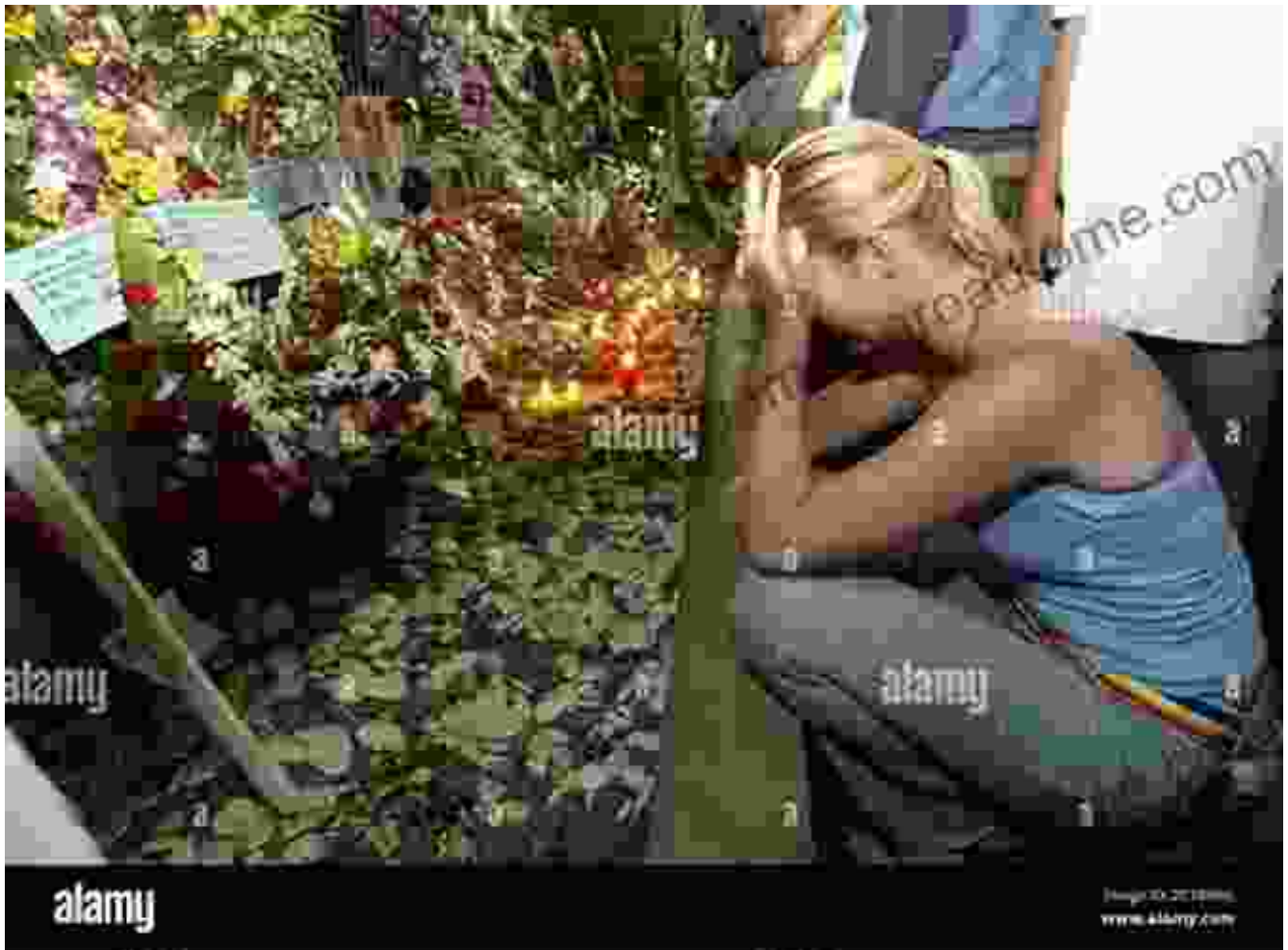

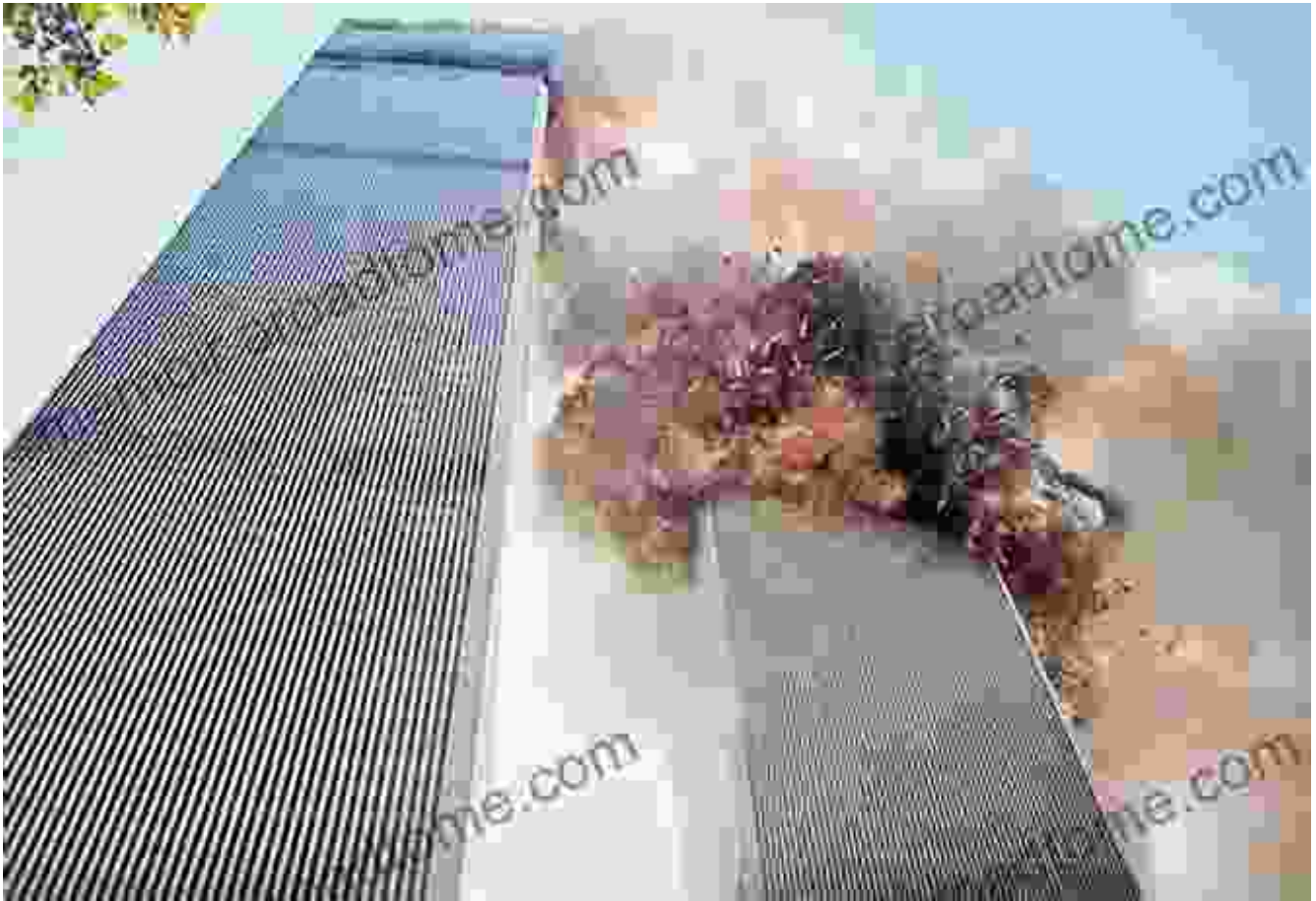

the smoke and debris in the air.



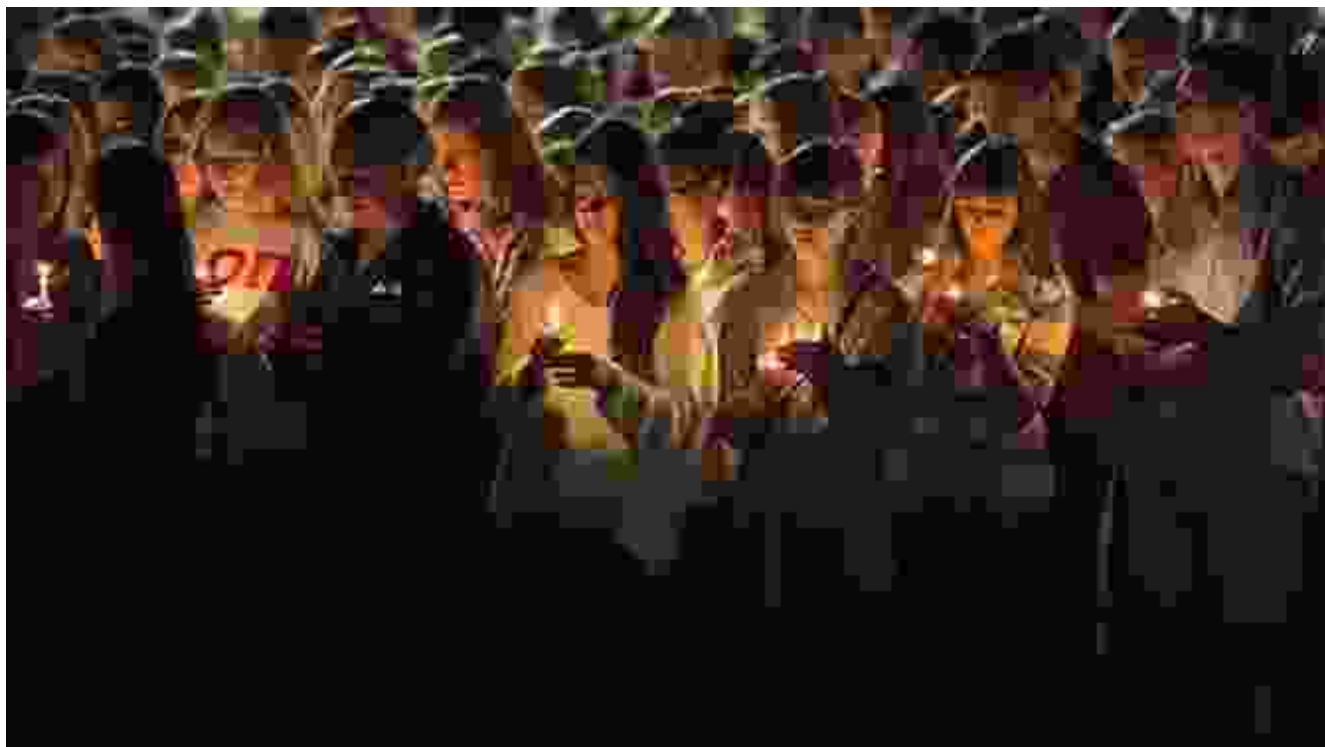
Davis started to take pictures of everything she saw. She wanted to document the horror of that day and to show the world the suffering of the victims.
